HILDA HUT INFO SHEET

Welcome to Hilda Hut!

Access is from our helicopter staging area on the shores of Arrow Lake in Burton BC. The flight from Burton staging to Hilda Hut takes approximately 12 minutes. From the helipad at Hilda you'll walk about 20 meters to the hut entrance. Stow your skis on the covered porch and come on in! The ground floor features a tiled mudroom with a wood stove and drying racks. Hang up your coat, leave your ski boots here. The main bathroom / shower room is on the ground floor along with 2 guest bedrooms, 2 staff bedrooms, office nook and a cold food storage with fridge and freezer.

The kitchen, dining area and living room are located on the 2^{nd} floor and feature a huge handcrafted dining table, wood stove and comfy sofas. There are lots of picture windows that give a stunning view of the surrounding mountains and forest. There are two doors on the 2^{nd} floor that access the wrap around covered deck.

On the 3rd floor are 5 guest rooms, a bathroom and a common area for stretching. The beds are super comfy, and we provide all the bedding including down duvets. Bedrooms are double occupancy suitable for couples or singles.

 - Avalanche safety gear transceiver, shovel, probe
 - 35-40 L day pack (Balloon pack, Avalung, ABS or other avalanche pack optional)
 - Gortex jacket, Gortex ski pants or other snow repellent fabric, down or puffy jacket, base and mid layers, 2 pair of ski gloves, toques, buff, ball cap
 - Ski goggles, helmet
- * Thermos, water bottle (or hydration pack), Re-useable lunch sack
- * Hut booties or sandals with non-marking soles for the lodge, deck and trip to the sauna
- * Prescriptions, medications, basic 1st aid supplies that you might need
- * Sunglasses, reading glasses, headlamp
- * Camera and charger
- * GPS (self-guided groups)
